Port Elizabeth - Isithembiso Babies Home received an early Christmas present last week when the Eastern Cape Nomads Golf Club donated R120,000 to the home. Eastern Cape Nomads fundraising initiatives culminated this year in the annual Andrew Mentis Endowment Fund Golf Day at Port Elizabeth Golf Club on 20 August drawing a field of 156 golfers.

"Our main roles, as Nomads, are to foster the development of golf, and to assist those less fortunate than ourselves," said Greg Clack, Eastern Cape Nomads' Vice Captain. Clack said that Nomads Eastern Cape intends to purchase a vehicle for the home with the monies raised. Collectively, the twelve Nomads Golf Clubs countrywide should raise more than R1,29 million for pre-selected charities in 2009.

"This donation will go a long way to help with the care and transport of our babies at the home," said Angeline McLagan, Co-ordinator at Isithembiso Babies Home. Isithembiso Babies Home, based in Port Elizabeth, is a place of safety for babies or toddlers who have been orphaned or abandoned. The home cares for babies up until the age of 3, after which they are either fostered or adopted.
